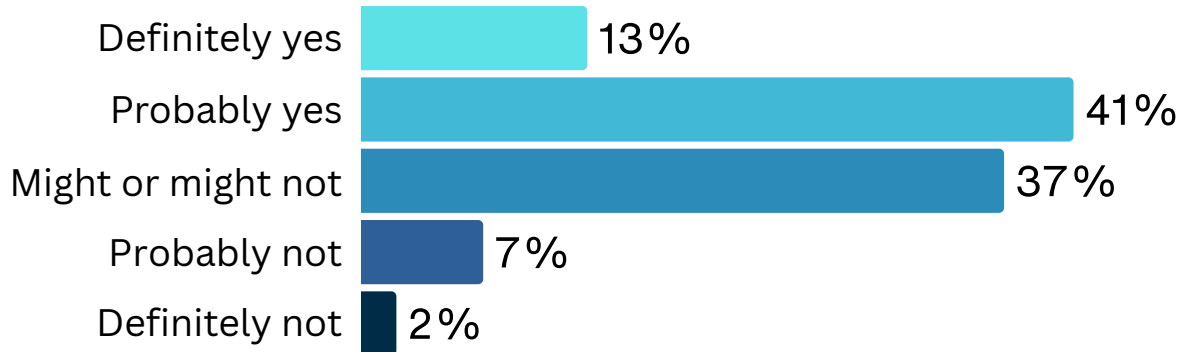

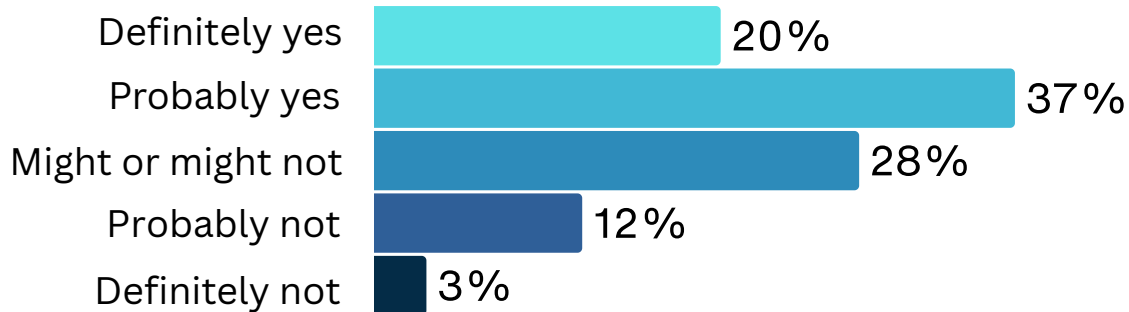
Feedback Summary

Churches sense a need for solid biblical teaching as many young people appear to have significant gaps in their understanding of the Bible. Some are experiencing challenges connecting young people into the life and community of the church, while others are getting creative, meeting young people where they are— including in the digital space.
