

Your Seed, God's Harvest

Travel with a missionary pastor who is taking the Good News to West Africa

Although we don't know each other, I have felt your prayers and have seen the difference your gift of God's Word makes in places like my home country of Sierra Leone.

I want to tell you how your seeds of faith—planted through your ongoing prayer and generosity—have led to an incredible harvest in West Africa, taking the gospel where it has never gone before!

I Experienced Your Gift Firsthand


In my childhood days in Sierra Leone, my friends and I would run door-to-door, talking to people and inviting them to church. I didn't know that was "missions"; I never wanted to become a pastor. I simply wanted to share the love of Jesus.

Years later, I moved to the United States to study. I earned multiple degrees and built a successful career. Later, my wife Florence and I started a church in our basement. We shepherded the church into a thriving congregation near Atlanta. For many years, I have poured myself into preaching, counseling, chaplaincy, and prison outreach. But I always felt that something was missing.

That all changed two years ago, when I encountered the ministry you make possible through American Bible Society!

My wife and I were in Kenya, attending a training hosted by American Bible Society and other ministry partners. We learned about the End-to-End program and how it's being used to

spread the gospel through visual, audio, and print Scripture. But we never expected that our hearts would be touched by this ministry.

I remember sitting beside my wife, holding an audio device in my hands. We were hearing the Bible come alive in Mende—the language of our hearts, the language of our families, the language we grew up thinking, praying, and dreaming in. It's impossible to tell you how amazing it was!

In English, we understand the Bible. But in Mende, we felt God's Word spark something new inside of us. Even with all my experience and studies, I'd never encountered the Bible like this. It was as if we were hearing the gospel for the very first time, and our hearts overflowed with joy.

All I could think was, *This is what I have been looking for!* And I knew that I had found what God wanted me to do.

You Made a Way for Us to Bring the Gospel to a Muslim Village

After we realized what End-to-End could mean for sharing the gospel with our people, we couldn't wait to start.

As soon as we arrived in Sierra Leone, we began working with a missionary friend, Musa, and others to reach their communities. We were making incredible progress. But there was still a challenge ahead of us.

Sierra Leone's population is 80 percent Muslim. Other Christians had tried to bring the gospel to Muslim villages before. Even Musa had made several attempts but had been turned away.

These were the people God wanted us to reach.

When I told him where we needed to go next, Musa said he wasn't sure they would allow us to come. But I had experienced what your gift of God's Word in my language could do. Even though I wasn't certain if we would be successful, I told Musa, "When we go, we will give them an audio Bible as a gift, so that they can begin to hear that the Jesus they are running from can speak their language."

With this mission, we traveled to the first village by motorbike to meet with the village chief and the local imam. Without gaining approval from these two men, there would be no way for us to reach the people. All I brought with me was the audio Bible. I gave it to the chief as a gift and told him, "This is something I have encountered, and I want to share it with you."

My friend, you cannot imagine our joy when we returned the next day and learned that the chief had not only listened to the Bible, but told us, "There is truth in this."

That evening, with the blessing of the chief and the imam, the village gathered together to watch the story of Jesus in Mende. As they watched the life of Jesus in their language, we saw people's faces change. They wanted more.

Then, the chief asked a question I will never forget: "Can you build a church here?"

The village wanted to begin immediately. Everyone was involved, from the youngest children bringing buckets of water to the women and men forming the bricks with their own hands to

the local carpenters who built the pews and the pulpit. Even when a heavy rain destroyed their progress, the community didn't give up. For the longest time, these people had seen the Bible as foreign. But because of you, they saw and heard the gospel in Mende, and they knew this Good News was for them.

"This is the truth," the chief told us. "We want our children to learn this new way of knowing God."

The church used your audio Bible to learn more about God until they found a resident pastor. Soon, people from other communities began to ask us, "When will you bring a church to my village?" That's how, one Easter morning, we saw what God can do with even the smallest seed of faith.

We Saw an Easter Miracle!

When it came time for a second church in a nearby village to open its doors, it was almost Easter. But the village didn't want to celebrate alone—they wanted to invite the neighboring villages to join them. The only issue was that Easter Sunday fell at the height of Ramadan, a month of fasting and prayer for Muslims.

People began to tell me, "This is a risky thing to do. It's too bold. Not only are you going to Muslims with the gospel, but now you want to launch a church during a time that is sacred to them."

To tell you the truth, I didn't know what would happen. But I knew that we serve a God of miracles—he had already brought us this far.

So, on Easter Sunday, we opened the new church, joined by dozens of visitors from other Muslim villages. The crowd was so large that we needed to add extra seats outside. During that unforgettable service, we listened to the Mende audio Bible together. God worked miracles, signs, and wonders. People were healed in the name of Jesus.

Then, we invited people to give their lives to Christ.

Almost the entire congregation raised their hands, including the chief who first received your gift of Scripture in his language!

Afterward, even though it was the Ramadan fast, everyone shared the feast we had prepared to celebrate the resurrection—and the new life you brought to this village through the gospel.

Before they returned home, our visitors told us, "We're ready. We want this same God to come to our villages."

Your Gift is Multiplying!


After that miraculous Easter Sunday, I knew that my assignment from God was to continue this life-changing work.

We've already seen a spiritual harvest born from your faith and God's faithfulness. In the original village we visited, the chief told us that the Bible helped him become a better leader and mediator. Families who were enemies for years have reconciled. Crime rates have dropped. And God answered prayer by blessing the village farms with a more bountiful harvest than ever before.

One man told us, "Since a church was established in this community, we have been brought out of darkness into the light through the teachings which have revealed truth to us."

Today, we celebrate 14 churches built in Muslim villages in Sierra Leone since 2023!

But this good news is not just for Sierra Leone. It's for the Kingdom.



Hearing the gospel in your heart language is an experience like no other. These Mende speakers can now hear the words of Jesus in their own language through your gift of audio Bibles like the one pictured here.

That's why we're training believers in other West African nations like Senegal, Guinea, the Gambia, and Liberia on how to use End-to-End. These people are braving tough terrain, harsh weather, and even the possibility of persecution because they know the power of what they carry. The gospel is changing lives, everywhere it goes. And God is blessing our work through faithful partners like you!

Every time a child hears God's Word in their Muslim schoolroom; every time a mother sees the gospel unfold on the screen; every time a village gathers to listen to the Bible in their common language, seeds are sown.

You have opened doors to places where the gospel has not gone before!

Whether you give, pray, or even spread the news about what God is doing by sharing my story with a friend, it's not wasted. Every seed sown in Africa is bearing fruit, and I am seeing it firsthand.

Because of you, I can say with the Apostle Paul:

My ambition has always been to proclaim the Good News in places where Christ has not been heard of, so as not to build on a foundation laid by someone else. As the scripture says, "Those who were not told about him will see, and those who have not heard will understand."

(Romans 15:20-21)




You Reached Students in Tanzania with God's Word

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Houses of Healing

You're helping churchgoers and church leaders alike encounter true healing in Jesus

One ordinary Sunday, you sit in the church pew, listening to your pastor preach.

The open Bible on your lap feels more like a weight than a lifeline. You can't seem to focus on the words, and you can't catch a glimpse of the hope you're supposed to find in its pages. Instead, your heart is heavy with pain.

You can't see it, but the pews are full of other people who are hurting too. The causes vary: a tragic loss, a long-term addiction, a heartbreaking family conflict. But the symptoms are the same.

In your suffering, you all feel far away from the people around you—and even farther away from God.

Now, imagine what this congregation looks like from the pulpit.

Your pastor knows that some people in the pews are hurting, and suspects that many more—like you, perhaps—are suffering in silence. But how can the church help?

Today, many Christian leaders feel poorly equipped to minister to people in their pain. That's especially true in the United States, where churches tend to emphasize the Bible's most hopeful and positive messages. But when people can't hear a message of hope through the noise of their pain, it's a daunting task to help them grow in faith.

And with many church leaders shouldering heavy burdens of physical, emotional, and spiritual burnout, the mission of helping others heal can sometimes feel impossible.

That's what you're helping to change—church by church, across the United States. Through our Restoring Hope ministry, you're equipping the church to respond to people's pain with hope grounded in God's Word.

Finding Christ in the Middle of Pain

The need is real.

Approximately 60 million Americans attend a church on any given Sunday. That number spans ages, cultural backgrounds, races, and denominations. It represents small-town churches with faithful congregations of dozens and large churches that welcome thousands each week.

But according to church partners we visited this year, there's one thing that

all these 60 million Americans bring to church: their pain.

"Not everyone has a trauma due to some atrocity that life brings, but everyone sitting in the pew has experienced pain," says Pastor Kim Gegner of New Hope Ministries in Roslyn, PA. "From the youngest children to the oldest person in the pew, that's our universal. That's what brings us all together."

Whether life-changing trauma or everyday stress, emotional suffering is a matter of spiritual concern. And if pain is compounded by stigma or seen as something that should be left at the church door, people often keep their pain to themselves—even when they're seasoned church leaders.

"All of my life, I've been in Christian circles," says Pastor Kim. "But I was never taught that the church could heal."

Over time, the burdens we carry can keep us from growing closer to God or finding community in the church.

"Unresolved pain will hold anyone back," says Pastor Reina Olmeda of Transformation Church in Allentown, PA. "You can't clearly see the love of God. You can't receive a sermon of hope. It's very difficult to hear what's coming from the pulpit when there is this barrier of pain."

The Bible is full of stories that reflect this reality. In Exodus, the Israelites are so broken by generations of slavery that they cannot hear God's promise of deliverance from Moses (Exodus 6:9).

While Job remains faithful amid his grief, his lament includes vivid images of being attacked and abandoned by God (Job 16).

In a healing group, people explore what God's Word says about their pain. This process often helps them share about their suffering, opening the door for restoration and resilience through Christ.

In Psalm 22, David asks why he has been forsaken by God and describes how his pain affects him physically, emotionally, and spiritually. And in his agony on the cross, Jesus echoes David's words: "My God, my God, why did you abandon me?" (Matthew 27:46).

"We have a suffering Savior—a Savior who experienced our pain," says Pastor Steve Brubaker of Grace Community Church in Willow Street, PA. "If my job as a pastor is strictly to alleviate pain, I'm on the wrong track. I want to be able to find Christ in the middle of pain, and then encourage others that you can live through this and even grow closer to the Lord."

Our Savior's suffering is the reason healing is possible. He knows our hearts and carries our burdens. And through him, we have the promise of present comfort and future glory.

When we're in the middle of suffering, this is the message we need.

Bearing One Another's Burdens

Restoring Hope aims to equip every Christian leader in the United States to proclaim this message of hope to everyone whose heart is heavy.

The idea is that, with the right pastoral tools, every church can become a safe place for people to bring their pain to Jesus in all the challenging seasons of life—from disaster and trauma to everyday stress, worry, anger, or sadness.

This ministry expands on the proven methods of American Bible Society's Trauma Healing Institute (THI), which has helped people heal from trauma and recover from disaster in 153 countries worldwide.

Developed and refined over 25 years, the THI approach combines mental health practices with the wisdom of Scripture to help people and communities thrive.

"We know that our Bible-based method is effective," says Rebecca Taguma, Senior Director of THI and Restoring Hope at American Bible Society. "And not just in times of crisis, but in all of life's challenging seasons. That's why our ministry is expanding beyond acute trauma to help people with all kinds of pain and hurt. Our role is to help your church become a place where people can flourish, grow, and meet Jesus in new and transformative ways."

Church leaders who have tried it say the program is already making a difference.

"The Restoring Hope program itself is very simple, but it's based on a lot of profound thinking around the issue of pain and suffering," Pastor Steve says. "It's biblically based, but it's counseling astute, and they've integrated those two things very well. We've never come across a program like this."

At the heart of this ministry are small group Bible studies led by a trained facilitator that walk through the program together. It's a format that's familiar to most churches, but with proven tools to guide people through conversations about pain and suffering with the wisdom of Scripture. Each group travels through lessons that help them identify and voice their pain, bring their suffering to the cross, and move forward in the light and joy of Christ's love.

Through Restoring Hope groups, churches become communities where people help bear each other's burdens (Galatians 6:2).


"When you're in pain, the tendency is to withdraw physically, emotionally, and even to move away from God," says Pastor Reina. "When people are in pain, they need a sense of community. Through the groups, they receive that. Through the groups, they realize, 'I am not alone in my struggle...' The groups, to me, are one of the best resources that we have offered our church."

"It's Miraculous"

What's it like to walk through a healing group journey?

At first, church leaders say, you might be apprehensive or confused about what to expect. Pastor Kim remembers leading a teen healing group for students struggling with drug abuse in the school connected with her church. For the first couple meetings, the teens didn't want to talk at all.

This initial silence is common—along with other markers of pain, trauma, and isolation. Some people struggle to look others in the eye. Some feel the weight of cultural stigma against vulnerability and avoid showing any emotion. But as the group explores what God has to say about their suffering, something shifts.





As people walk through the Restoring Hope journey, they encounter God's promises and find a safe space to share their pain with others. This process helps people move through suffering and experience hope for the future.

"You're hearing a biblical story, which really connects you with people from the Bible and humanizes them," says Pastor Reina. "It allows for you to step back and reflect and talk about how that resonates."

As you hear these stories, you might start making connections of your own. People of different ages, life paths, and experiences begin sharing how they see their pain in the light of God's Word. Many times, this opens the door for you to share, too.

It's this process that helps people bring their burdens to Jesus and find a way to continue growing in the community the church provides. And while a typical Restoring Hope healing group only meets for six sessions, church leaders see healing and resilience that endures.

Pastor Kim watched the teens she led through the healing group become

more open as their journey progressed. Since then, the school hasn't reported any new drug abuse. In addition, she's seen young people in her church take ownership of their faith as they learn how the Bible connects to their lives.

"I think Restoring Hope is the best thing I've ever seen to help people understand why their faith is relevant," she says. "It's miraculous, and I put that directly to the healing groups and what they do."

Restoring Hope is designed with your church in mind, making it simple to invite anyone on a journey of healing.

Pastor Steve remembers church members telling him that their pain felt less daunting after sharing their stories for the first time in a healing group. And Pastor Reina has seen how healing groups have changed the way people approach their role in the body of Christ.

"People may have walked in thinking, 'I have too much hurt to be part of anything,'" she says. "After the group, they ask me, 'How can I serve the church now?' God's Word restored something, and now the way they view life and their purpose and their effectiveness for the kingdom has completely changed. It's God's Word, restoring hope, moving them forward to the future. It's powerful!"

"It Was Like Having New Eyes"

Restoring Hope is making a lifechanging difference for people in the pews—but it's for people in the pulpits, too.

Research shows that seven out of every ten U.S. church leaders are themselves bearing wounds of trauma. Beyond acute trauma, pastors report worse physical, mental, and emotional health than the American public overall, and significantly more suffering than other practicing Christians.

But pastors using Restoring Hope in their churches are realizing that their pain matters.

Pastor Steve remembers going through a church split that nearly broke him decades ago.

"It was the most painful thing I experienced, barring losing a family member," he says. He lost friends, mentors, his job, and his sense of direction for the future. But he didn't fully process his pain until his church piloted the Restoring Hope program. Participating in it changed everything.

"It was like having new eyes," he says. "I didn't realize how much I was being weighed down by not addressing this in my own life, this pain I was carrying."

As church leaders heal, they're better equipped to lead their congregations and become powerful ambassadors of Christ's healing in their communities.

"It's something that pastors have been clamoring for," Pastor Reina says. "We want the resources; we want to talk about this." With tools from Restoring Hope, now they can.

A Journey of Transformation



How Mark and Nancy Hanson are driving transformation through End-to-End

Mark Hanson stood in a classroom in Kenya, facing 30 young students in matching uniforms.

"How many of you have Bibles?" he asked.

Only three children raised their hands.

"How many of you would like Bibles?"

Every hand went up.

Years later, Mark still remembers this as a turning point in his understanding of the vast need for God's Word around the world and how he could help. Together with his wife, Nancy, Mark is a faithful supporter of our End-to-End program and a passionate advocate of how God's Word transforms lives—including his own.

A Vehicle for Change

Growing up in a Christian family, Mark always knew who Jesus was. He went

to church. He had good values. And he worked hard to help build his father's auto parts business. When his father sold the business after a cancer diagnosis, Mark began working for Sea Foam Sales Company, which he eventually purchased. The next 15 years were a whirlwind of product demonstrations at warehouses and auto parts stores as he focused on expanding the business.

"I was on the road a lot," Mark remembers. "I'd be gone for two weeks straight, come back, straighten out everything at the office, and then hit the road for another two weeks."

The company grew quickly, and Mark began to realize that Sea Foam's success could make a difference for others.

"We started giving half our profits away," he says. "Transformation became a theme of what we supported, because people change when Jesus gets into their life. And Sea Foam became the vehicle for that change."

Each year, Mark would invest in Christ-centered ministries, including prison outreaches and rehabilitation programs. The better the business did, the more he had to give away.

Then, in 2004, a difficult divorce upended Mark's life.

"It was brutal," he remembers. "When you're in the middle of darkness, you can't see the other side. It was just nothing but despair."

As he began the long process of healing, Mark surrounded himself with support. He joined a Bible study group and searched for comfort and strength in God's Word. The same good news he'd shared with others became a solid foundation for his faith, even

when everything else seemed to be falling apart.

"I often relate to the book of Job because Job goes through really good times, and then he goes through his really hard patch," Mark says. In his own hard patch, Mark saw his relationship with Jesus grow more real than ever before.

"What I can tell you is that when you go through dark times, there is another side to the story," he says. "Today, I am in a place where I'm far better off than I ever would've been. Some place along the way, I found a closer relationship with Jesus."



End-to-End creates a way for people around the world to encounter God and receive a Bible of their own.

"A Full-Circle Transformation"

Around this time, Mark received a call from Jim Sheldrew, a philanthropic advisor at American Bible Society. He asked Mark if he'd like to come to Peru and see what God was doing

among the Quechuan people. What Mark witnessed was the earliest stages of End-to-End—a ministry partnership that combines visual, audio, and written Scripture to disciple unreached people, plant churches, and change communities through the power of the gospel.

"The Quechuans had the Bible in Spanish, but until it came in their heart language, they didn't understand it," Mark says. "When Jesus came in their language, it transformed them."

Eager to see more, Mark traveled to Rwanda, where people were using the Bible to build bridges of reconciliation



after the devastating genocide a decade prior. He remembers sitting among a crowd watching gospel films about the life of Christ.

"It was the first time they'd seen a film in their own language," he says. "They were happy as Jesus went through his life—he's doing miracles, he's amazing! But then he ends up on the cross. People were in tears. How could the Savior of the world end up on the cross?"

By the end of the film, people were eager to hear more about this Jesus who laid down his life for his enemies.

"We'd say, 'If you want to learn more about Jesus, come back tomorrow,'" Mark says. "And every week they came back to listen to the Bible. And those listening groups began to grow."

Finally, on a trip to Kenya, Mark saw the last piece of the puzzle: a personal

Bible. Most of the students he met couldn't afford a Bible. End-to-End offered a journey that every person could take to receive God's Word—no matter where they lived, how much money they had, or what language they spoke. He saw people move from curious onlookers to passionate followers of Jesus Christ, ready to carry the good news to their communities.

"End-to-End is a full-circle transformation, from first encounter with Jesus to having your own Bible to life changes that impact your community," Mark says. "It's powerful!"

Mark became one of End-to-End's earliest supporters. When he met his wife Nancy 15 years ago, he found someone who shares his heart for changing lives through the gospel. Together, they helped convene ministries they loved for the greater purpose of reaching more people through End-to-End.

As the gospel spread through the program, Mark saw the difference it made in communities. Common issues like alcoholism decreased dramatically. Families became more unified. Enemies reconciled. Churches were planted.

"As people changed, things in their villages began to change, too," Mark says. "Spiritual transformation really does impact a person's life here on earth. It doesn't solve all their problems. It didn't solve all of my problems! But it certainly helped change my point of view."

"An Amazing Journey"

The Bible shaped the way Mark ran his business. It helped him through the most difficult years of his life. Today, he and Nancy are continuing to share this most precious gift through End-to-End, which has expanded to serve people in 71 nations!

"We've developed an understanding that we give second chances at Sea Foam," Mark says. "We give second chances to engines and equipment so that we can give second chances to people."

Looking back, Mark sees how God used his own story of transformation and his role as a business owner to build the Kingdom.

"I sell Sea Foam for a living. That's all I do," Mark says. "But through that, we can provide funds to get the gospel out."

Like you, Mark and Nancy find their greatest joy in knowing that the transformation they see will last for eternity.

"I've been able to see literally thousands and thousands of people transformed through finding Jesus. It has been an amazing journey," Mark says. "But to know that not only do you find Jesus in your lifetime and your life today gets better-but the bonus of eternal life? That's a pretty amazing end of your story." ■
